General Workshop Info

Each school may submit up to 4 workshops & EVERY SCHOOL should submit at least one! © Presenters must attend a workshop training prior to submitting an application* *Students who presented a workshop at Zone or State in 2016 are excused from the training. Workshops are 40 minutes

Your workshop should be **fun and interactive** but you MUST TEACH something that students can take back to their council/life and use.

It is not a share session or a lecture - teach through activities and games!

Your workshop may be very general (community service) or specific (How to organize a food drive). Think about what you/your council or school does uniquely or exceptionally well. What are YOU an expert on? What is your passion?

You must present your workshop somewhere before you apply (In leadership class is OK!)

Be creative! (We can't select 20 workshops on assembly planning!!

To Present at ZONE

- Presenters may be Juniors or Seniors
- 1 or 2 people may present together
- Presenters do not count as part of the 15 delegate limit

To Present at STATE

These are selected by the Host School and the NASC Executive Directors.

- All eligible workshops will be evaluated at Zone for State consideration
- Presenters must currently be juniors
- 1 or 2 people may present together: The SAME Zone Presenters must attend/present at State
- Presenters do not count as part of the 10 delegate limit
- Your school is responsible for all expenses associated with your workshop (and registration/hotel for State)

To Present at NATIONALS

These will be evaluated & recommended to the National Office based presentation at Southern Zone. Final selection is made by the National Office.

- Presenters must currently be juniors
- 1 or 2 people may present
- The SAME Presenters must attend and present together at Southern Zone & State
- You/your school is responsible for all expenses associated with your workshop (registration, travel...)

Can you submit a workshop that you have already done in the past? Yes! But you should not "steal" someone else's ©

- > WARM UP/OPENING activity (no more than 5 minutes) Optional Must be related to your topic - Don't do a game just to do a game! DO NOT do a name game with the whole room at the beginning.
- ➤ TEACHING

You should use at least 3 methods to teach - video, song, activities, ppt etc.

- ACTIVITIES to learn and/or apply knowledge
- > SUMMARY/wrap-up (How will they use this?? What does it all mean?)

You may not use food in your workshop without prior approval from Mrs. Ginger. Video must be "G" rated unless approved by Mrs. Ginger.
